## REQUIREMENTS FOR ISSUING AND RENEWING WRITTEN CERTIFICATIONS FOR MEDICAL CANNABIS

Linthicum, MD January 24, 2020) – The Maryland Medical Cannabis Commission (the "Commission") is used in this bulletin to remind certifying providers of: (1) certain regulatory requirements they must comply with to obtain and maintain registration and; (2) actions that the Commission may take when these regulatory requirements are violated.

1. A certifying provider must conduct an in-person assessment of a qualifying patient before issuing or renewing a written certification for medical cannabis. Assessment via telephone, video, or other means of telecommunication does not suffice.

Regulations addressing this issue provide:

- In order to register as a certifying provider, a provider must submit an application that includes an attestation that the provider will complete a physical examination, of a qualifying patient before issuing a written certification for medical cannabis.<sup>1</sup>
- A certifying provider must have a bona fide provider-patient relationship with a qualifying patient in order to issue a written extification.<sup>2</sup> A certifying provider must complete an in-person assessment of a qualifying patient in order to establish a bona fide provider-patient relationship.<sup>3</sup>
- A certifying provider may renew a written certification for medical cannabis only if the provider made a full, in-person assessment of the qualifying patient within the past 365 days.<sup>4</sup>
- 2. A certifying provider may not accept compensation from a licensee without approval from the Commission. A certifying provider must obtain Commission approval to attend an event sponsored

by a licensee if the certifying provider will advertise their services at the event or receive compensation or referrals as a result of attending.

Regulations addressing this issue provide:

- A certifying provider must apply for and obtain approval from the Commission before receiving compensation from a licensee.<sup>5</sup>
- Compensation includes promotion, recommendation, advertising, subsidized rem, or anything of value.
- 3. A registered certifying provider who fails to conduct an in-person assessment of a qualifying patient before issuing or renewing a written certification for medical cannabis or receives compensation from a licensee without commission approval may be fined, have their registration revoked, and/or be reported to their licensing board.

Regulations addressing this is the provide:

- A registered certifying provider is subject to a fine of up to \$5,000 for each violation of COMAR, Title 10. Subtitle 62. A registered certifying provider subject to a fine must pay it or request a hearing within 30 days after receiving notice of the fine.
- After written notice and a hearing, the Commission may revoke the registration
  of a certifying provider who fraudulently applied for approval, fraudulently
  issued a written certification, or violated COMAR Title 10, Subtitle 62, Chapter
  34.8
- The Commission shall report to a certifying provider's licensing board any instance of fraud or conduct by the certifying provider that threatens public health.<sup>9</sup>
